Alabama's April 2014—March 2015 unemployment claim overpayment rate was 6.192%, equaling over \$14 million.

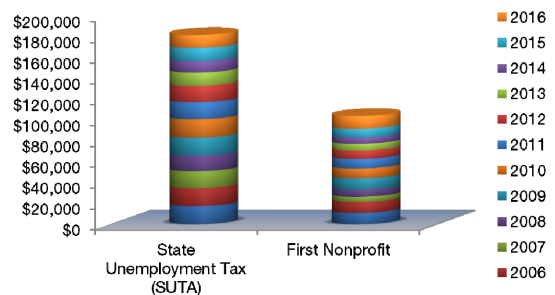
