What do state unemployment taxes (SUTA), state unemployment reserve balances and claims overpayment rates mean to your nonprofit?

*These factors could mean less money for your nonprofit organization's cause.*

Factors used in calculating employer unemployment rates have increased, therefore increasing the average unemployment tax cost per employee from \$140 in 2009 to \$208 by 2015.

**\$58 Million**

UNEMPLOYMENT CLAIM OVERPAYMENTS

Georgia's April 2014—March 2015 unemployment claim overpayment rate was 11.900%, equaling over \$58 million.

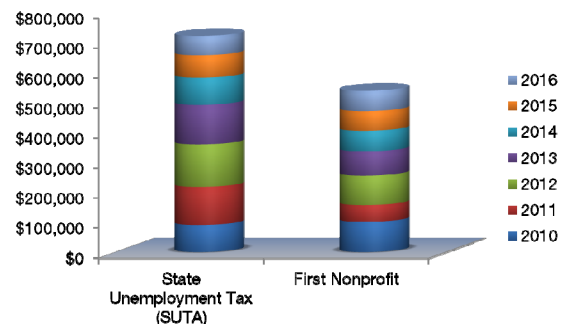
