## \$1,300 - \$11,800

FULL UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFIT AMOUNTS

An unemployment claim can range from \$1,300 to \$11,180 per claimant, if collected for the maximum benefit duration of 26 weeks. However, there are options to financing your nonprofit organization's unemployment costs...
