

# Unemployment insurance cost facts every *Maryland nonprofit* should know

What do state unemployment taxes (SUTA), benefit amounts and claim overpayment rates mean to your nonprofit?

*These factors could mean less money for your nonprofit organization's cause.*

## Maryland



### 42% Increase

2009-2015 INCREASED TAX COST

The average state unemployment tax cost per employee increased from \$173 in 2009 to \$246 by 2015.

### \$127 Million

UNEMPLOYMENT CLAIM OVERPAYMENTS

Maryland's April 2014—March 2015 unemployment claim overpayment rate was 19.052%, equaling over \$127 million.

### \$1,300 - \$11,800

FULL UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFIT AMOUNTS

An unemployment claim can range from \$1,300 to \$11,180 per claimant, if collected for the maximum benefit duration of 26 weeks.

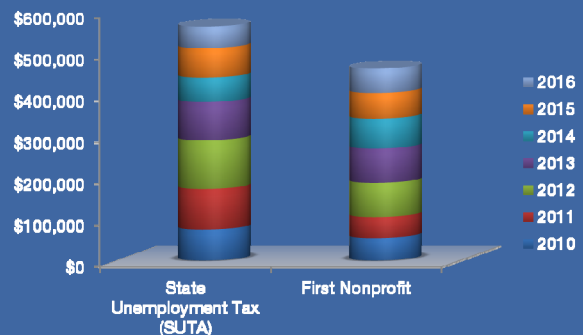
