SUTA TAX COST PER EMPLOYEE

Massachusetts has long been a high-cost state when it comes to employer unemployment insurance. Since the latest recession, the average state unemployment tax (SUTA) cost has stayed at over \$460 per employee.

\$143 Million

UNEMPLOYMENT CLAIM OVERPAYMENTS

Massachusetts' April 2014—March 2015 unemployment claim overpayment rate was 9.960%, equaling over \$143 million.

\$990 - \$31,410

FULL UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFIT AMOUNTS

An unemployment claim can range from \$990 to \$31,410 per claimant, if collected for the maximum benefit duration of 30 weeks.

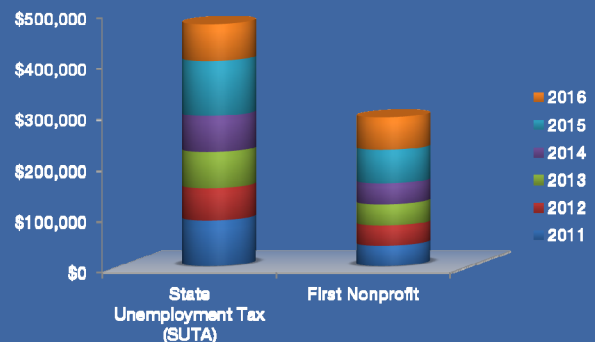
