Factors used in calculating employer state unemployment rates have increased; therefore increasing the average unemployment tax cost per employee by 33% since 2009.

A claimant can collect up to a maximum of \$14,534 on a single claim.

2016 Net Trust Fund Balance

According to the U.S. Department of Labor, Illinois is financing unemployment at 28% less than their minimum adequate financing rate.

Illinois' 2016 net trust fund balance is only slightly higher than pre-recession balances (\$1.43 billion in 2008) and revenue into the trust fund has continuously declined since 2012.

Illinois' 3rd quarter 2015 through 2nd quarter 2016 unemployment claim overpayment rate was 10.828%, equaling over \$192 million.
